Talk of growth in our congregations often centers around such things as "I don't know everyone anymore!" or "We need more people to balance the budget!" What if we understood growth in our congregations as something necessary to our souls? There has been a great deal of attention paid to the notion of "radical hospitality" which sounds a little scary!
